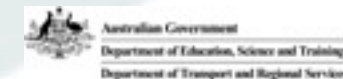

The purpose of the Macarthur Youth Summit is to:

- **Provide an avenue by which young people and community members can identify and state their concerns in relation to regional youth issues.**
- **Inform and contribute to ongoing planning and review processes already underway across the region.**
- **Identify and clearly articulate the school to work transition issues and any underlying socioeconomic issues impacting on Macarthur's young people.**
- **Ensure that the broader Macarthur region has a resource that will assist in the development of coordinated youth plans for future program and resource allocation to the region.**

Discussing school to work transition issues the Learning to Earning - Macarthur Youth Summit will bring young people, youth service providers, government and non-government representatives together to share their viewpoints and to develop an issues and planning resource for Campbelltown, Camden and Wollondilly local government areas.

The program consists of small group discussions around three key themes to develop responses and strategies to these issues.

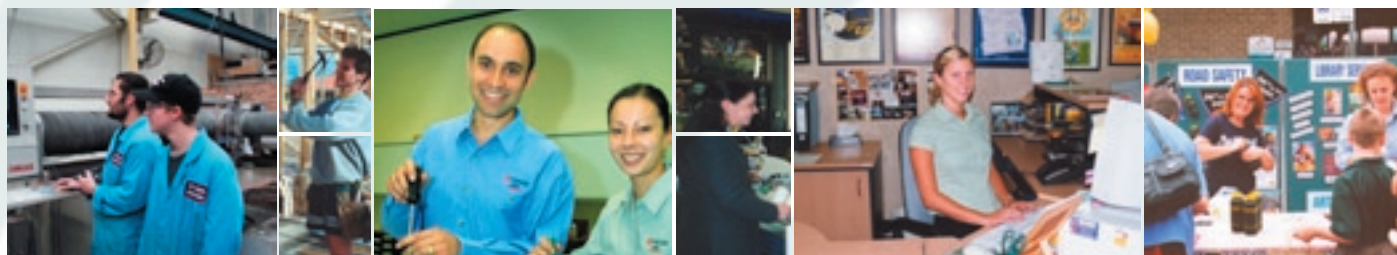
Young People Being Heard :

Sector Forums :

The Macarthur Youth Summit is structured to include 3 Sector forums that would provide input to the summit as a whole.

- **Forum 1: Young People: Local young people drawn from high schools, unemployed, part-time workers, associated youth clubs and services, TAFE, UWS, etc**
- **Forum 2: Community and Non-Government Services: Local community and non-government organisations inclusive of job network, schools, social, youth welfare, cultural, and religious.**
- **Forum 3: Government Services and Authorities: All government services represented in the area from the federal, state and local levels.**

All forums will identify and explore issues relevant to their sectors and to suggest and/or develop possible recommended strategies to address the issues. Responses can include further coordination of services, broadening of existing programs and initiatives, new initiatives, etc.
